## Summary of February 25, 2014 Faculty Meeting

- 1. Update on Lecturer search. B. Braun gave a summary of hiring decisions for lecturer search. There was no subsequent discussion.
- 2. Update on change from GWR (Graduation Writing Requirement) to GCCR (Graduate Composition and Communication Requirement).
  - B. Braun gave a presentation. Courses must be certified by the university as meeting GCCR requirement. This needs to be fit into the major in some way. Executive Committee supported Option 4: Create a new 3-credit hour required for all primary mathematics majors to satisfy GCCR.

## A. Possible modes of implementation

- (i) Add a new course to the curriculum that represents one of the 18 hours needed at the 300+ level to satisfy major requirement.
- (ii) Add a new course to the curriculum that represents a 7th course in the 300+ level requirement for major.

## B. Discussion

- (i) This change does not apply to Math Econ program. R. Molzon states the reason for this is that Math Econ is a completely separate program.
- (ii) Prerequisites for the course were discussed. These may include combinations of the following: 113, 114, 213; 261 or 214; 322; 351, 361, or 471.
- (iii) Course requirements and sample syllabi were discussed.
- (iv) The timeline for implementation was discussed. The course needs to appear in the bulletin Fall 2014 for incoming 1st-year students. The first time the course will be offered is Fall 2015. Expedited approval of courses is expected from the university.
- (v) Writing requirements, oral requirements, resources for grading, and enrollment caps for these courses were discussed.
- **C.** A vote on matters related to this topic will take place during the faculty meeting on March 4, 2014.
- 3. Update on Faculty search. P. Hislop gave details on recent developments. Much discussion ensued. Several straw votes were taken regarding the type of offer(s) the chair should make.
